I included a free code for a Twinkl account in your lockdown packs.</p> <p>Practical activities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Pick a number. Work out what is one more and one less. Try and do this practically (pick an object to stand for 10/the tens and an object that can be used as the 'ones').• Quiz. How many tens are in... say a number and get your child to demonstrate by building the number how many tens and ones are in the number.• One more and one less bingo. Play bingo, but instead of calling out number, ask for one less or one more than the number you are calling.• Comparing numbers using the more than and less than sign ('<' and '>').• Making doubles. Give your child a number and ask your child to double it. Discuss how to double a number and what happens to the number when you double it. <p>Additional maths tasks are available on multiplication and division on MyMaths.</p>

Pick a different one to practise each day.</p> <p>I will send a Marvellous Me to those children who have played at least one game each day on EdShed. https://www.edshed.com/en-gb</p> <p>To gain access to a particular phase 3-5 sound:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Go onto the web game • Click more lists • Then assignments • Then you should have access to games for all the phase 3-5 sounds. <p>Try one of the phase 5 set of sounds and practise writing those words into sentences.</p>	<p>Please concentrate on using capital letters, full stops, finger spaces, adjectives and ensuring that letters are correctly formed and on the line. Try and include 'and' into your sentences and 'because'.</p> <p>Please re-read <i>Grandad's Island - Benji Davies</i> before attempting the lessons below. If you do not have the book at home, there are videos of people reading the book on YouTube.</p> <p><u>Pick one task to complete each day.</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How would you describe Grandad's house? Could you write a sentence / paragraph to describe it? How would you describe the island? 2. Make a list of similarities and differences between Grandad's house and the island. Where would you prefer to live (and why)? 3. Imagine that a member of your family has a secret ship (or a different type of vehicle). Where would you go to? Why? Draw a picture of the place to go with your writing. 4. Write a letter that might be inside the envelope that Syd receives at the end of the story. 5. Draw a picture of someone's house that you know. Draw the garden and the house then label it. Use adjectives to make your labels more interesting e.g green grass. Remember to check your spelling.

Learning project for this week:

Science

- Design a new ship for Grandad using different materials and test to see if it will float. Could you have a competition with your family to see which ship will hold the most cargo without sinking?
- Find out about jungle habitats. What kinds of animals and plants live there? How are they adapted to live in those conditions?

Geography

- Imagine that you could travel on Grandad's ship. Use a map to plan the journey that you would take around the world.
- If you could travel to Grandad's island, what things would you need to take with you? Explain why you will need each item.

History

- There is a local explorer called Captain Cook. Research some facts about him and create a fact file.
